## Summer Reading 2020: Imagine Your Story

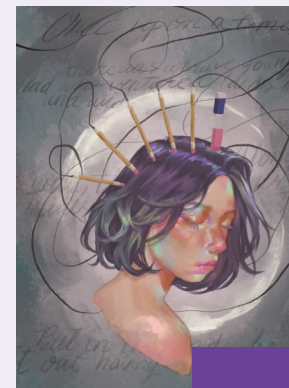
Read for 15 hours over the summer to earn a free book! For all teens in grades 6-12.
